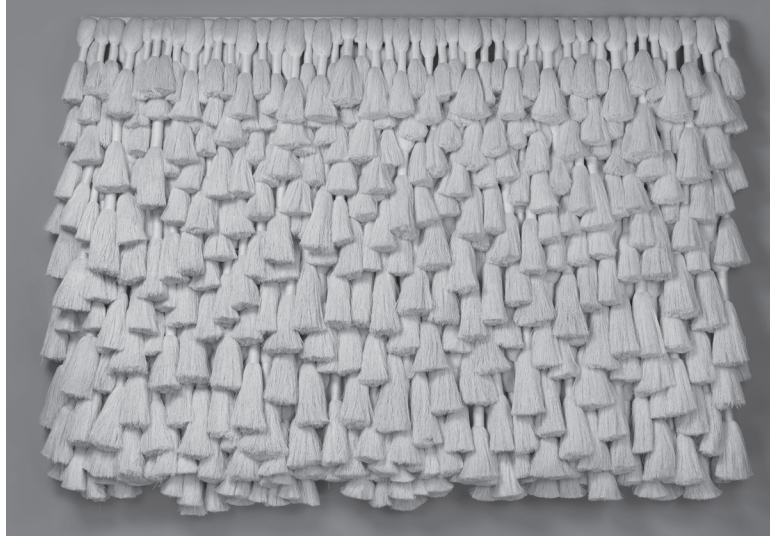

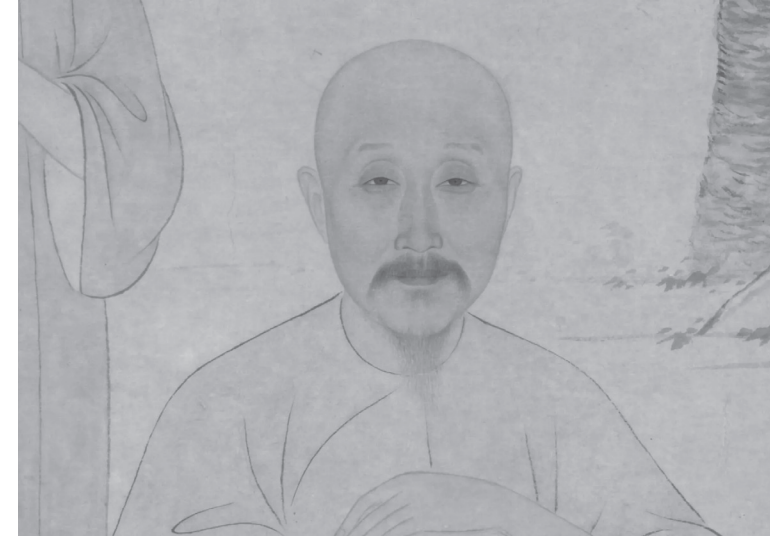

Casual, family-friendly dining that offers delicious options for visitors of every taste, including pizza, sandwiches, salads, soups, desserts, espresso, and other beverages.

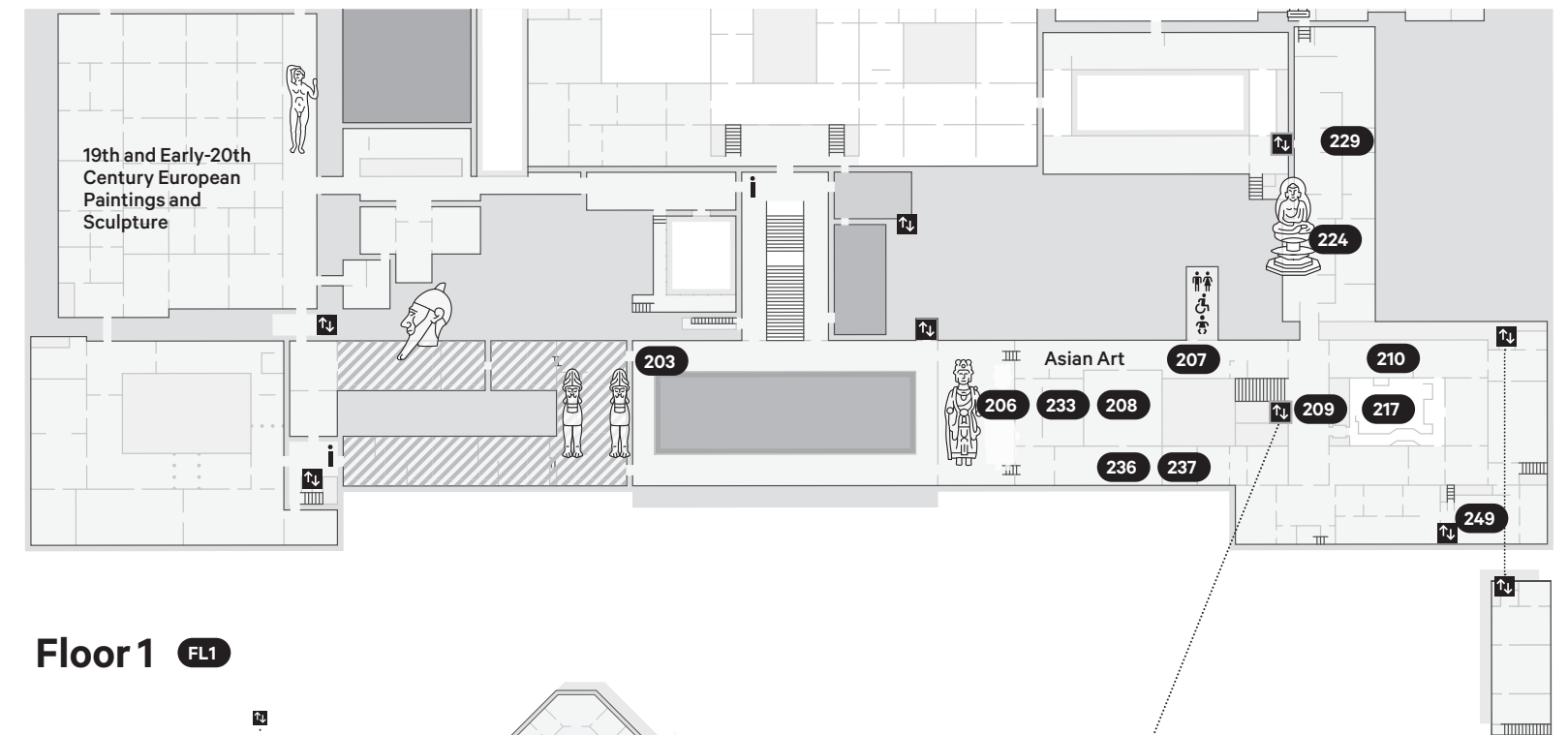
#### The American Wing Cafe \$

Enjoy snacks, pastries, coffee, and a variety of beverages in a soaring, light-filled pavilion with views of American masterworks.

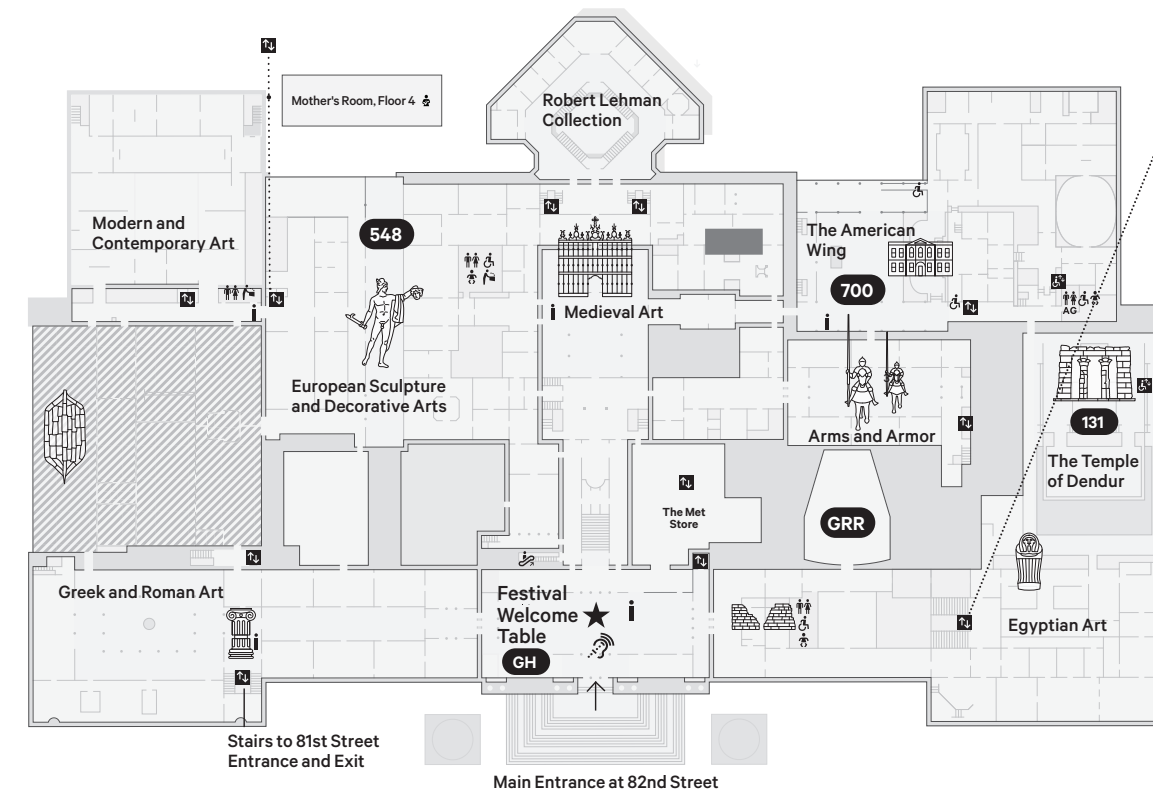

## Floor 2 (detail) FL2

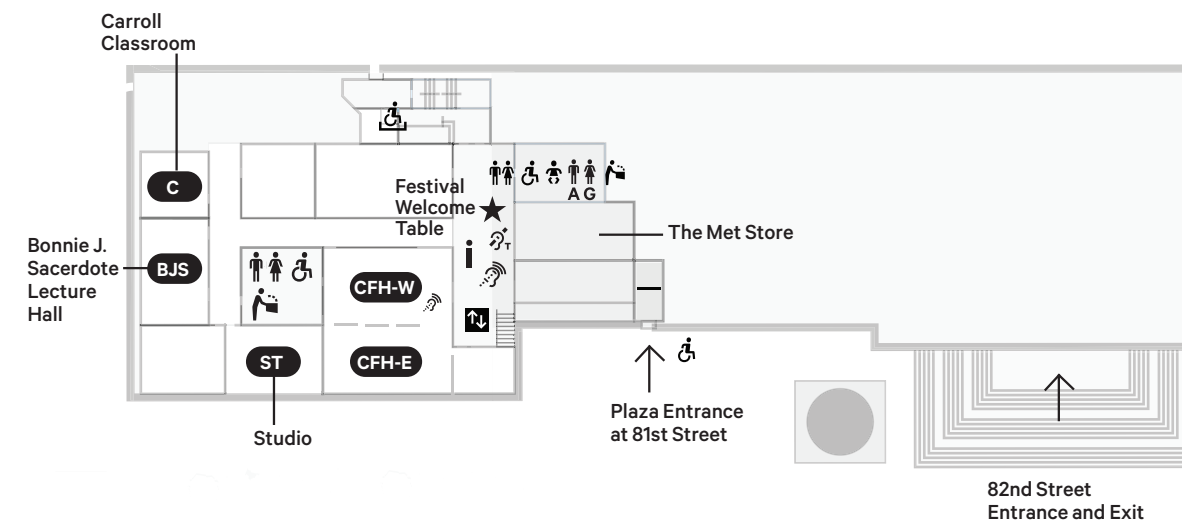
