- 1916 Born and raised in Saint Paul, Minnesota, the daughter of Theodore W. Griggs and the former Mary Steele Livingston, both heirs to family businesses in railroads, banking, lumber, and other ventures
- 1938 Graduates from Sarah Lawrence College, Westchester County, New York
- Receives a master's degree in clinical psychology from Columbia University, 1942 New York
- At the urging of the architect Walter Gropius, travels to Japan, the first of 1954 more than thirty trips there; commissions a house on Centre Island in Oyster Bay, Long Island, inspired by Japanese architecture and gardens
- Marries Jackson Burke, a type designer and printer; the Burkes have homes in 1955 New York; Hobe Sound, Florida; and Cable, Wisconsin
- Purchases an eighteenth-century *Tale of Genji* screen at auction in New York 1956
- The Burkes begin to seriously collect Japanese art when they acquire the 1963 Frank E. Hart Collection of more than seventy ukiyo-e paintings in Palm Beach, Florida
- Begins taking courses on Japanese art at Columbia University with Professor 1965 Miyeko Murase, who subsequently becomes her primary art advisor
