# **Morocco: Land of Mists & Mysteries**

Dear Members and Friends of The Metropolitan Museum of Art,

As a crossroads of cultures through history, Morocco is an exhilarating destination. Join me in September 2023 for a 12-day tour of this mesmerizing North African country. I've worked on museum projects across Morocco, and I look forward to introducing you to its exceptional museums, vibrant artisans' workshops, lavish palaces and mosques, Roman ruins, and energetic, exuberantly colorful cities.

We'll begin with four nights in Marrakesh, where we'll explore its bustling markets, spectacular gardens, and the opulent 16th-century Saadian Tombs of Moroccan royals. At the Berber Museum, before opening hours, a curator will guide us through 600 precious Berber objects collected by Yves Saint Laurent, followed by a private visit to his beautiful estate, Villa Oasis. We will also visit El Badi Palace, where we'll see how Met conservators have restored the 12th-century Koutoubia *minbar* (pulpit). In the scenic nearby Atlas Mountains, you may enjoy an optional day-excursion to a local Berber village.

Over a stop in Casablanca, Morocco's largest city, view its ornate Hassan II Mosque, one of the world's largest. In the capital of Rabat, the majestic Hassan Tower, Mohammed V's white marble tomb, and the winding streets of the medieval Kasbah des Oudaïas will inspire awe. Traveling by high-speed train, we'll arrive in the fabled Tangier and visit the little-known nearby city of Tétouan. In its UNESCO-recognized medina, we'll witness artisans creating wonderful crafts, from embroidery to traditional Moroccan *zellige* tiles.

After a stop in Chefchaouen, the famous blue city, we'll enjoy three nights in magical Fes at a boutique *riad* (traditional Moroccan house) reserved exclusively for us. Fes's exquisitely tiled courtyards will dazzle us, an excellent example of which we'll find at the 14th-century Al-Attarine Madrasa, an inspiration for the design of The Met's Moroccan Court. We will venture outside Fes to ancient Volubilis, one of North Africa's best-preserved Roman cities, and UNESCO-listed Meknes, once Versailles's 17th-century rival, before concluding with a return to Casablanca.

I hope you join me on this unforgettable exploration of Morocco's splendors.

# Traveling with You Christopher Noey

Christopher Noey is an art historian, author, and Emmy Award-winning producer of films on art and culture. An expert in Asian and Islamic art, Mr. Noey has taught at Williams College and the City College of New York. At The Met, he created video installations for a diverse array of exhibitions including Jerusalem 1000-1400: Every People Under Heaven, and he was series director of the innovative online features 82nd & Fifth and The Artist Project, in which he interviewed 120 contemporary artists on how they are inspired by The Met and its collections. He also documented the building of the Museum's Moroccan Court and traveled to Fes to film mosaic tile production as well as the great historic courtyards of the city.

# **Trip Highlights**

- Join a curator for a before-hours tour of Marrakesh's Berber Museum, featuring Yves Saint Laurent's extensive collection of ancient Berber treasures, followed by an exclusive visit to Villa Oasis, Saint Laurent's private sanctuary
- Explore Marrakesh's El Badi Palace and its 12th-century Koutoubia minbar, whose intricate marquetry has been beautifully restored by Met conservators
- Delight in a full-day excursion to the scenic Atlas Mountains near Marrakesh and visit a local village to learn about the Berber culture and hospitality
- In the often-overlooked city of Tétouan, with its spectacular UNESCO-listed medina, take a private visit to its Dar Sanaa school to observe local artisans at work
- Go behind the scenes at the Fes Arabesque Ceramic Factory / Art Naji Studio, where you will see ceramists at work and learn about Morocco's world-famous pottery traditions
- Tour the UNESCO-listed hilltop city of Meknes, whose palatial grandeur rivals that of Versailles, and marvel at Volubilis, one of North Africa's best-preserved Roman cities
- Enjoy three nights at a boutique *riad* in Fes exclusively reserved for us and visit the city's 14th-century madrasas and the extensive *souk* with its 11th-century tannery

#### Saturday, September 30

Upon arrival in Marrakesh, transfer to the hotel and enjoy lunch. Gather this evening for introductory remarks from Chris Noey and a welcome reception, with dinner at leisure. L, R

# Marrakesh

#### Sunday, October 1

After a morning lecture, unearth the secrets of Marrakesh. Beginning in the medina, the old walled section of town, gaze up at the Koutoubia Mosque and its soaring minaret. Stroll through the *souks* on our way to the famous Djemaa el F'na Square, an ancient meeting place filled with dancers, storytellers, and snake charmers. At the opulent, Moorish-inspired La Mamounia hotel, enjoy a lunch filled with a variety of local delicacies. Afterwards, visit the El Badi Palace to see the Koutoubia *minbar* (pulpit). beautifully restored by the Met conservators. Continue to the Bahia Palace, the former home of a 19th-century Grand Vizier, and the graceful arcades of the 16th-century Saadian Tombs, the burial ground of the royal family. Enjoy a festive welcome dinner. B. L. D

# Marrakesh

#### Monday, October 2

Before opening hours at the Berber Museum, enjoy a curator-led tour of its rich collection of Berber objects before a private visit to Villa Oasis, the home of the late fashion designer Yves Saint Laurent. Stroll in the lush Jardin Majorelle, then have lunch. This afternoon, we plan to tour the Ben Youssef Madrasa, a beautifully restored 16th-century Koranic school (*pending confirmation*), before a visit to the Dar El Bacha Museum. This evening, attend a private reception on the rooftop of Les Jardins de la Koutoubia overlooking the Koutoubia Minaret. B, L, R

# Marrakesh / Atlas Mountains

### Tuesday, October 3

You may opt for a full-day excursion to the scenic Atlas Mountains, which separate the coastal lowlands from the Sahara Desert. Visit a local village and learn about the Berber culture and hospitality. Lunch is at an award-winning retreat featuring peaceful landscaped gardens, breathtaking views, and an on-site farm. Alternatively, spend a day in Marrakesh exploring contemporary art galleries, perusing local boutiques, and enjoying the cultural richness of the red city at a leisurely pace. B, L

# Marrakesh / Casablanca / Rabat

#### Wednesday, October 4

Depart for Rabat with a stop in Casablanca, where you will visit the Hassan II Mosque to admire its dramatic architecture and tour the Museum of Moroccan Judaism. Drive along the coast to the capital city of Rabat to check in at the new Fairmont La Marina Rabat-Salé Hotel. Gather for dinner this evening at a local restaurant. B, L, D

## Rabat

#### Thursday, October 5

Following a morning lecture, visit the Archaeological Museum to admire its collection of excavated treasures highlighting Morocco's impressive history, and/or explore the Mohammed VI Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art. Continue to the ancient Chellah necropolis, which features Roman ruins alongside medieval Islamic tombs. After lunch, see the Hassan Tower and the white marble tomb of King Mohammed V. Then, in the oldest part of the city, tour the Kasbah des Oudaïas, which has sweeping views of the Atlantic Ocean and the river Bou Regreg. This evening, we might have the opportunity to attend a performance at the recently built Grand Théatre de Rabat designed by Zaha Hadid (pending schedules). B, L

# Rabat / Tangier

Friday, October 6

Travel by the new high-speed train to Tangier. Upon arrival, lunch is at an exquisite property overlooking the ocean. After a visit to the American Legation Museum, the only U.S. National Historic Landmark outside the United States, tour the Kasbah Museum, which houses local treasures dating to antiquity, including Roman floor mosaics from Volubilis. Stop at St. Andrews Church and/or Nahon Synagogue. This evening, dinner is at the hotel. B, L, D

# Tangier / Tétouan

#### Saturday, October 7

Drive to nearby Tétouan, with its UNESCOrecognized medina. Discover Dar Sanaa, the school of traditional arts and crafts, to see local artisans at work and learn about the different artistic expressions that have flourished for centuries in the city. Then peruse the Museum of Religious Heritage housed in the Luqash Madrasa. Return to Tangier for an evening at leisure. B, L

# Tangier / Chefchaouen / Fes

#### Sunday, October 8

Travel to Fes, the oldest of Morocco's imperial cities, stopping en route for lunch in the magical blue city of Chefchaouen. Upon arrival in Fes, check in to the Dar Lys, a beautiful riad reserved exclusively for us. Dinner this evening is at a local restaurant. B, L, D

## Fes

#### Monday, October 9

Visit the Nejjarine Funduq, an 18th-century caravanserai (inn) that is now a museum of wooden arts and crafts. Explore the Al-Karaouine Mosque, including the library (pending confirmation). In the afternoon, tour the Bou Inania Madrasa and the Al-Attarine Madrasa, both great examples of Islamic architecture followed by a visit to the tannery quarter. This evening, attend a reception and lecture at our exclusive riad. B, L, R

# Volubilis / Meknes / Fes

#### Tuesday, October 10

In the company of a historian, drive to the Roman town of Volubilis, where houses are adorned with mosaics from the second and third centuries A.D. Lunch is at a prestigious wine estate surrounded by luxurious gardens. Continue to Meknes, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, to see the beautiful Bab Mansour gate and shrine of Moulay Ismail. Return to Fes, where this evening you are invited for a festive farewell dinner at a private venue. B, L, D

Fes / Casablanca

#### Wednesday, October 11

Visit the Fes Arabesque Ceramic Factory / Art Naji Studio to view ceramists at work and learn the history and secrets of Morocco's

famously beautiful pottery. After lunch, depart for Casablanca and check into the Four Seasons Hotel Casablanca. This evening, enjoy dinner at the hotel. B, L, D

Thursday, October 12 This morning, check out of the hotel and transfer to the airport for your flights home. B
