

New England Masterpieces: Historic Collections From The Met to Maine

Dear Members and Friends of The Metropolitan Museum of Art,

Amid pastoral landscapes that inspired artists like Winslow Homer, New England's museums hold much of America's art heritage. As a longtime museum educator, I'm thrilled to invite you on a beautiful spring journey from The Met to Maine this May. We'll go behind the scenes of New England's most historic yet often-overlooked art spaces, enjoying private viewings of their diverse holdings. Along the way, we'll enjoy elegant accommodations, including a tranquil inn by the sea in southern Maine.

In New York, we'll begin at The Met with exclusive after-hours access. I will guide you through The Met's collections of American artists we'll see on this trip, including John Singleton Copley, Childe Hassam, John Singer Sargent, Winslow Homer, and others. After an overnight stay at New York's Essex House, we'll set forth for Boston, stopping for an inside look at Connecticut's Florence Griswold Museum, once an artists' boarding house run by Griswold. Many of the late 19th-century American Impressionists lived and painted here, and it's now a museum housing their creations.

In Boston, we'll embark on a special tour of the extensive American art collection at the Museum of Fine Arts and then on to the lavish Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum. We'll admire Gardner's collection of works by her legendary friends such as John Singer Sargent as well as eclectic antiquities from her wide-ranging travels across Europe, Asia, and the Middle East. In nearby Cambridge, a private tour of Harvard University's Fogg Museum will delight us with works spanning from the Middle Ages to Picasso. We'll then venture to Manchester, New Hampshire, where we'll join a curator to experience the Currier Museum of Art's deep collection of medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque artworks, including a well-preserved 14th-century altarpiece.

In Maine, a special treat awaits: We'll enjoy a behind-the-scenes tour of Winslow Homer's home and studio, where he lived and painted for decades. On our way back to New York, we'll meet the Head of Education for a private tour at Hartford's palatial Wadsworth Atheneum Museum of Art, America's oldest continuously operating public art museum, which opened in 1844.

Special receptions and private gallery tours will round out this unique New England experience. I hope you join me at The Met this May for this enriching journey.

- In Maine, delight in a behind-the-scenes look at **Winslow Homer's fascinating home** and studio, which are not accessible to the public





Saturday, May 20

Spend time at the Portland Museum of Art this morning. In the afternoon, delight in a specially arranged, private inside look at the life and genius of Winslow Homer at his home and studio which is not usually accessible to the public. From 1883 to 1910, the American painter lived and worked in this coastal studio where he created many of his masterpieces. This evening, enjoy a special reception and dinner at the hotel as we say farewell to Maine.

Cape Elizabeth / Hartford, Connecticut / New York City / Return

Sunday, May 21

Travel to Hartford, Connecticut, to visit the Wadsworth Atheneum Museum of Art for a private tour with the Head of Education. This museum, which is housed in a castle-like building in downtown Hartford, is the oldest continually operating public art museum in the United States. It was founded in 1842 and opened to the public in 1844. Return to New York early this evening for the conclusion of the program.
